A colour copy of the household registration booklet (hukou) including pages of your family members.

If you have changed your name, provide evidence of the name change.	
If you have served in the armed forces of any country, provide discharge papers with English translations.

•	Cambridge English: Advanced (CAE) with a total band core of at least 147 based on the 4 test components completed within 12 months of visa application lodgement			
<u>Note</u> :	From 12 February 2024, only results from the paper-based Cambridge C1 Advanced test (previously known as Cambridge English: Advanced CAE) will be accepted for Australian visa and migration purposes.

•	Completed at least one year of full-time study or equivalent towards an award at an institution in Australia where all instructions were in English.
